## From our Superintendent:

Elba passed their annual budget on Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Elba's budget history chart is included in this newsletter. The biggest change in Nebraska's budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year was legislature LB 644. LB 644 states the tax asking cannot be more than 2% increase in the tax asking of the previous year. There is also some percentage of real growth added to the 2% in your county. Elba's percentage in which I could increase the tax asking was 2.63%, so the tax asking could not exceed the 2.63% amount of the previous year. LB 644 legislature in turn affected our tax levy. In 2020-2021, the tax levy was .961955. In 2021-2022 the levy was .96342 and the 2022-2023 school year is .954962. If any school district goes over their tax asking percentage increase a school employee will have to go to the public entity meeting and explain their tax asking increase. Elba did not exceed their tax asking, so they will not be attending the meeting. See chart for more budget details. If there are ever any questions, please ask Ms. Pritchard.

#### What is bullying?

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children. It involves a real or perceived power imbalance and the behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. Both kids who are bullied and kids who bully others may have serious, lasting problems.

#### How can I prevent bullying?

- Help kids understand bullying. Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help.
- Keep the lines of communication open. Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns.
- Encourage kids to do what they love.
   Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.

#### **Bullying Prevention at EPS**

Mrs. Reiman will be addressing the effects of bullying in the classroom this month during Guidance lessons. EPS takes bullying very seriously and invites collaboration with families to resolve the situation, protect the bullied child, and support all students involved. 
