Advance notice of the meeting was published in the Phonograph Herald on September 2 and September 9 for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestion or observations of taxpayers relating to the proposed budget. The budget details were available at the office of the Superintendent during regular business hours.

The budget hearing was called to order by President Dvoracek at 8:00 p.m. Roll call of members present: Graves, Higgins, Rasmussen, Spilinek, Dvoracek. Others present included Superintendent Pritchard and members of the public. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. President Dvoracek stated that the hearing was in compliance with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act as posted in the room.

Motion by Spilinek, seconded by Higgins to excuse Kristina Radke from the board meeting. Yes — Spilinek, Rasmussen, Higgins, Graves, Dvoracek. No -0. Motion carried 5-0. Radke arrived at the meeting at 8:12 p.m.

Superintendent Pritchard presented the proposed budget to the board of education and patrons. The proposed budget sets the tax asking at \$1,565,657.00. The increase in general fund expenditures is for increase in salaries, curriculum adoption, and instructional materials. Ms. Pritchard also presented an amount to be taxed for the building fund in the amount of \$20,505.00. The asking for the building fund is to maintain the physical building and to begin saving for storage expansion. The total proposed budget sets the tax asking at \$1,586,162.00.

The purpose of the hearing is to hear support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to setting the final tax request at a different amount than the prior year tax request.

Also, in attendance was Superintendent Pritchard and members of the public. The amount of \$0.949519 is for the General Fund expenditures and \$0.012436 is for the building fund. The tax rate does not exceed the current budget limits set forth by the Department of Education of Nebraska.
